The February 11, 2008 meeting of directors of the Alton-Godfrey Rotary Club was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Josh Farley. Others in attendance were, Roland Hansen, Scott Neudecker, Tom Turpin, Mike Osborne, Bill Moyer, Sam Stemm, Bryan White, Rod Elias Allen McBride.

Others in attendance, Jeannine Kelly, Larry Thompson, John Rain.

On a motion by Scott Neudecker, seconded by Bill Moyer the minutes and treasurer's reports were approved

In Club Administration, Larry Thompson said the District Assembly training is scheduled for May 10. The 5 new standing committee chairs need to be appointed before this date. The Club will pay for the expenses incurred for the training. He also said there are 2000 tickets available for the Cards-Cubs game on May 3. This game is a fundraiser for the District Literacy Project. Josh Farley, for Ron Mayhew, reported that Ratchet is now available on our website – www.altongodfreyrotary.org and will no longer be emailed. Josh said the Simplified Grant has been received from District 6460 to purchase the 30-40 t-shirts for the kids in the program at the Motivational Achievement Center sponsored by the Boy Scouts, Alton-Godfrey Rotary.

In Club Public Relations, there was no report.

In Service Projects, Chili Chowdown is being held March 3 at Main Street Methodist Church. The committee reviewing request for donations had the following recommendations. Place a ½ page ad in the Pride Annual Dinner Program for \$100.00. Pride, Inc is honoring Jack Jacoby this year. On a motion by Bill Moyer, seconded by Rod Elias the board approved this expenditure. Requests from the USO, Impact and the PineWood Derby were declined. These will be forwarded to Ford Phillips to write the on letters.

John Rain presented a request from Page Humbert to attend the People to People Leadership Council in Washington, DC this summer for 7 days. The total tuition is \$2194.00 and in her letter she said any amount would be appreciated. Bryan White made a motion that we give her \$250.00 towards the tuition

seconded by Bill Moyer. Bill Moyer said every request should stand on its own merit. The motion was amended to add that the check should be made out to the organization and not her personally. Since this program is very similar to Whitewater and we have budgeted for 3 students and traditionally only 2 attend the money will come from this fund. The motion passed.

In Foundation, Bill Moyer is looking at 3-wheel carts that would be sent to countries to help those without legs. He is in the process of obtaining more information.

In Membership, Ron Mayhew has proposed Jennifer Thompson. On a motion by Sam Stemm, seconded by Scott Neudecker her membership was approved pending her attending two meetings. The board accepted, with regret, the resignation of Larry Hauck. Jerry Thomas asked to be moved to honorary status. On a motion by Rod Elias, seconded by Sam Stemm this request was approved.

In old business, the projector system being used at meetings belongs to Ron Mayhew and Larry Thompson. Larry said there is a used projector available for \$300.00. The Board asked him to get more information on the projector.

In new business, it was discussed continuing with the Alton-Godfrey Rotary membership in the Growth Association. A board member will speak with Monica Bristow to see who in the Club is eligible to participate in Growth Association functions.

The meeting adjourned at 5:55 p.m.
